Dr. Karyn Scissum Gunn joined California State University, Long Beach as Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs in July 2021.

Before coming to CSULB, Dr. Scissum Gunn served as an Associate Vice President in Academic Affairs at Cal State Fullerton since 2017. She provided leadership for initiatives to bolster inclusive excellence and equitable outcomes for all students, with an emphasis on retention, graduation, time-to-degree, and elimination of opportunity gaps. With a passion for student success and a mission to serve the campus and community, she has developed an impressive track record as an academic leader and innovative administrator.

Previously, Dr. Scissum Gunn spent over 20 years at Alabama State University in Montgomery, where she served as Professor, Department Chair, Dean, Associate Provost, and Provost. During her tenure, she spearheaded major academic initiatives and instituted enrollment management, virtual learning, and development. Additionally, she successfully led an institutional accreditation reaffirmation and reporting process and expanded faculty and student equity and inclusion.

Under her leadership, she garnered \$54.5 million in federal funding from NIH, NSF, USDA, and U.S. Dept of Education to support scientific research, student training and STEM faculty development, and state capital funding for a new instructional and research facility. She has produced more than 30 articles and 50 presentations and has authored three STEM degree programs. Dr. Scissum Gunn earned both her Bachelor's degree in Biology and a Master's degree in Cell Biology from Tuskegee University and her Ph.D. in Molecular Genetics from Auburn University.

As Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs, Dr. Scissum Gunn is responsible for directing nearly 4,000 faculty and staff members in the Division of Academic Affairs, the largest unit within the university. She oversees eight academic colleges including the College of Professional and International Education and the University Library.

I am excited for this membership year and the opportunity to work together with the fantastic volunteers on the Membership Committee. Join us!



Reading By 9 Celebrates 25th Year on September 20th

Please mark your calendar and join us this Wednesday, **September 20th**, at Rotary to be part of our 25th year of fundraising! As the meeting date approaches, we will provide more information on this year's programs being supported, matching grants, examples of what your donation will accomplish and how to donate if you are unable to attend on September 20th. Don't be surprised if I, or one of the other 20 Literacy Committee members, encourages you to attend and support the Reading by 9 Program. You can be assured that the Literacy Committee will work hard to maximize the effectiveness of your donation to provide books; support preschool, TK (transitional kindergarten), and K-3 students, teachers; and nonprofit and community literacy programs, focusing on putting books in the hands of children, especially in underserved areas.



Last year, a fundraising record of nearly \$130,000 was set by more than 120 Rotarians and guests contributing to our success at our Club's 5,000th meeting. This enabled more than **\$1 Million** raised since the program's inception. There have been more than **350,000** books and ebooks donated to Long Beach students, classrooms, libraries and literacy programs. As we celebrate our 25th Anniversary we are committed to maximizing our fundraising efforts and identifying programs that address early education and literacy needs in our community. This year's goal is to raise \$100,000, maximize matching donations, and increase as close to 100% Rotarian participation as possible. We realize these are lofty goals, but as we emerge from a pandemic which adversely affected reading progress, it is more important than ever to provide books to especially lower income and at-risk students and support early literacy endeavors.

We look forward to your participation in Wednesday's program to raise funds and celebrate the 25th year of our **READING BY 9** Program. New Rotarians, this is always a fun and inspiring meeting as in a few minutes - you will see the generosity of our members as hands are raised in the air and thousands of dollars are donated to support having students reading at grade level by age 9. We are glad to be at The Grand to again raise funds to benefit students in the Long Beach community!

Thanks to all for your past support. We hope you will again consider a generous donation to benefit our community's students as we celebrate 25 years of the Rotary Club of Long Beach's Reading by 9 Program.
