On November 22, 2014, Robert Luna was sworn in as the 26th Police Chief for the City of Long Beach. Chief Luna scareer in law enforcement spans over 34 years, beginning as a Reserve Police Officer with the Long Beach Police Department in 1985. He entered the Basic Police Academy as a Police Recruit in April of 1987 and has since promoted through every rank within the Department, working a variety of assignments. He has extensive experience in the areas of disaster and emergency preparedness, terrorism and critical incident management, and serves on several law enforcement and community-based boards. Chief Luna is a Joint Regional Intelligence Center (JRIC) Board Member, representing the Los Angeles County Region. He currently serves on the Major Cities Chiefs Association (MCCA) Executive Board as the Western Region Representative. He is an active member of the MCCA Homeland Security Committee and is an MCCA Police Executive Leadership Institute (PELI) mentor.

Chief Luna actively promotes the Law Enforcement Code of Ethics, policing in a smart, focused and effective manner, and treating people with dignity and respect. He advocates for the concepts of 21st century policing, which provide key elements that help strengthen community policing and trust among law enforcement officers and the communities they serve. He has been instrumental in helping to build and maintain productive and trustworthy relationships with the community and has received many awards from several community organizations for his civic leadership and engagement.

Chief Luna strongly believes in the importance of higher education and made a significant investment in his own education. He is a graduate of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) National Executive Institute, the FBI National Academy, the Harvard University Senior Executives in State and Local Government Program and holds a Master of Public Administration (MPA) from California State University, Long Beach.

Chief Luna is committed to ensuring a safe city for all people through sound principles, practices, and partnerships.

#### Accessing Rotary Online - Mobile DACdb Tutorial

On your phone use your web browser (my web browser is Safari) and enter <a href="www.m.dacdb.com">www.m.dacdb.com</a>. That should take you to a log in screen. Your Login name is your last name and first initial---beckm. Your Password is lb (for Long Beach) and your first name \text{\left} bmollie (and for your internet safety folks \text{\left}. I \text{\left} ve changed mine so hat). You do not need Club # but, if you wish, it's 840. Press \text{\left} Rem. Me \text{\left} so you don \text{\left} t have to log in every time. Press \text{\left} Login \text{\left}.

Now .at the bottom of your screen very bottom outside of the web site, is a box with an arrow pointing up. Press the box and it will open sending options such as Message Addid Reading List Reading List Add Bookmark etc. Scroll to the right to Add to Home Screen. Press that button and this web site will now save itself just like an app on your phone so you can access it anytime.

I find I use My Club the most and under that Members. They are in alpha order but you can search using just a first name if that sall you know. You I find their picture and all their contact information. even the option to text so the program sends you directly to your messaging app and you don that they to fuss with copy and paste.

If you want to use DACdb on your desktop, I find it so much easier to sort and do other functions there. <a href="www.DACdb.com">www.DACdb.com</a> use the same login information. It's always a good idea to check your own entry occasionally to ensure your business and personal information is current - if not, please let the Rotary office know.
