David Brinkman, M.B.A., Chief Executive Officer & President, joined DAP Health in 2006. David has led the organization through a period of unprecedented expansion, increasing the number of clients and volunteers, diversity and volume of services, number of staff, and size of the budget by 100%. Under his leadership, DAP Health established a dental clinic, a permanent supportive housing complex, a community center, a department of Community Health, a sexually transmitted infection (STI) clinic, and a vocational program as well as achieved Federally Qualified Health Center status.

During his tenure, DAP Health was named one of the "Top 20 HIV/AIDS Charities" by <u>About.com</u>, for the high percentage of funding spent on programs vs. overhead, fundraising efforts (raising \$100 for every \$15 spent), and financial transparency. In addition, Charity Navigator, America's largest independent charity evaluator, awarded DAP Health "four-star status" for five, consecutive years. This is an achievement reached by only 6% of all nonprofits they rank.

DAP Health has a history of not only seeing to the emotional, physical and medical care of their clients, but also for their family as well. That goal has insured a higher success rate of serving their patients and noting the common denominator is 90% of their patients live in the poverty level. As needs expand services have expanded and Covid 19 brought on the name change to DAP Health. Their vast experience with the AIDS pandemic was invaluable to our current Covid Pandemic. DAP Health has not only provided mental and physical health and financial assistance but added phones and WIFI for their clients to say connected.

DAP Health has also added woman's health and trans community health. With the DAP Health hotlines, volunteers, doctors, nurses, food delivery and delivery of essential supplies, even delivering toilet paper during the early pandemic made a huge difference.

If DAP Health doesn't have the service, they will find those that do. Mental health is a huge challenge with the isolation and fear Covid has brought. DAP Health currently has had 7,000 therapy sessions. They meet people where they are at believing peace of mind which helps their health.
