A point of presidential prerogative! **President Robin** introduced his mom, Gerry MacCartee and her partner Nancy Cobb for a Zoom tour of the history of Coronado. Gerry and Nancy have operated the Coronado Walking Tour for over forty years and today shared some of the history of Tent City. 120 years ago it was an age of innocence and Tent City opened south of the Hotel Del on June 10, 1900. It was \$.50 a day to rent a tent, and July 4, 1900 was the first 4th of July in Coronado and it attracted a lot of people, as today. Tent City lasted almost forty years before the automobile and the Depression changed visitors' habits. No worries if you missed this presentation as it will also be the last program of **President Robin's** tenure.
