Rotary Notes of Interest & Announcements

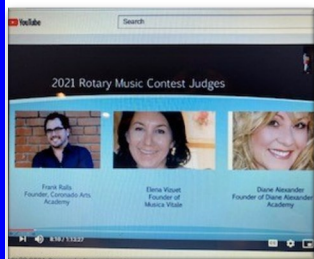
