Program

President Robin introduced Don Kent, president and CEO of the Hubbs-Sea World Research Institute for a discussion of a program they're working on involving aquaculture. They're farming the sea, or would like to. They are proposing offshore fish farms as a better alternative to agriculture to provide humans with the protein they need.
