Program

U.S. Attorney Randy Grossman was introduced by his pal **Sandjay Bhandi** for a discussion of the job of a U.S. attorney. Mr. Grossman is acting U.S. attorney in charge of 152 lawyers and 156 support personnel serving San Diego and Imperial Counties. His office's priorities are the border, human smuggling, and assaults on federal agents. The office has had great success against organized crime, Chinese intellectual property theft, white collar crime, and elder abuse. They are also very active in community outreach to help reduce crimes.
