Programs

Erin Fosdick, City of Longmont Senior Planner, provided information about the Longmont Main Street Corridor Plan. The 5-mile stretch of Main Street that extends from Highway 66 to Plateau Road has been the subject of her team's work since late 2018. There are recommendations for better gateways to Longmont at North Main and at South Main. Erin reviewed the goals to improve safety, mobility, and connectivity in the four sections of the corridor:

1. North Main from Highway 66 to 17th Ave.
2. 17th Avenue to 11th Avenue
3. Downtown
4. South Main (including the Museum & Recreation Center)

Erin highlighted an opportunity for public input on September 10 at the Longmont Museum auditorium from 5:30 to 7 p.m. The Main Street Corridor Plan summary & draft plan will be presented to the Transportation Advisory Board on Sept. 16 and the Planning & Zoning Commission on Sept. 25 before being presented at the Longmont City Council meeting on October 22.
