## Programs

Rick Samson introduced our program, which was a summary of Longmont's 3 ballot issues on the November ballot, presented by Jim Angstead and Jeff Friesner, both from the City of Longmont.

Competitive pool and ice rink

- The voters are being asked to increase the sales and use tax so that the City can build and maintain a pool and ice facility. Currently, Centennial pool is Longmont's competitive pool. It was built in 1974 and is heavily used and isn't optimal for current needs. The rec center pool is not equipped for swim meets because it lacks a spectator area. A leisure pool and fitness area would be included in the new facility. Centennial pool would be repurposed.
- The Roosevelt rink is also well used. It has limitations, including it's not suitable for competitive hockey and is not open year-round. The plan is for the Roosevelt rink to close if the ballot measure passes.
- A site has not been selected for the proposed pool and rink, but there are 4 candidates.

Permanent street fund tax extension

The voters are being asked to maintain the street fund tax. It was approved in 1986 and has been extended several times. The tax pays for maintenance and improvements to streets, snow and ice removal, street signs and other projects.

Amend the City charter to allow for 30-year property leases

Voters are being asked to allow the City to enter into 30-year leases. The City is currently limited to 20-year leases. Those in favor of the measure site the fact that it's not necessarily workable for tenants to get financing for a 20-year lease.
