Ashley and Cindy spoke of the recent outpouring of support from many individuals and businesses in our community. Ashley noted the need to pivot from usual practices to respond to immediate needs that arose when the pandemic hit. Thanks to the many donations, both hospital foundations have been able to ❖be generous and creative to support people in need.❖

Cindy estimates that \$90K in gifts and in-kind donations has been received. She has created an online blog, ❖COVID Kindness❖ to highlight and express thanks for the many acts of kindness. All of the monetary gifts have been used to purchase needed items at local businesses. For example, a donation used to purchase meals from a local restaurant which were then delivered to LUH in a show of support for the healthcare workers; thus, a ❖win/win❖ for the distressed local restaurant and for the stressed hospital staff.

Ashley also shared a statement from Marc Crowell, Executive Director of the O.U.R. Center noting the increased needs and community support that the O.U.R. Center staff is seeing during this time. Marc expressed appreciation for the generosity of many, including Twin Peaks Rotary who contribute to the feeding program.

Ashley concluded the program by reminding all that this is a time to put the Rotary motto of ❖Service Above Self❖ into action. Participation in the ❖Clean up/Green Up❖ workdays, the Strongmont Fund, and Help for Good are just a few of the opportunities before us.
