Rick Kalamaya piqued our curiosity with the following:

- What is the staple food of more than half of the world's population? Rice
- What is the most widely eaten fish? Herring
- What is the most expensive spice? Saffron

Rick wrapped up today's trivia session with some George Carlin quotes. For example:

Programs

Today's guest speaker was Matt Hannon who is a Business Sustainability Advisor for PACE Partners (Partners for A Clean Environment.) From their website: *Partners for a Clean Environment (PACE)* provides free expert advisor services, financial incentives and a certification program to help businesses measure and gain recognition for their energy, waste, water, and transportation achievements. See www.pacepartners.com to learn more. They are funded by Boulder County.

Matt explained their work by saying what is good for the environment can also be good for business. He focused his talk today primarily on recycling and composting, noting that the recycling is a huge industry in Colorado involving an estimated 85,000 jobs. He encouraged those interested to take a tour of the Recycling Center to see the complicated work of sorting single stream recycling from our recycling bins to their appropriate destinations.

In a show & tell format, Matt held up examples of items that can and cannot be recycled through the single stream recycling bins commonly used in Boulder County. Yes, please recycle paper, flattened cardboard, glass bottles, plastic, and aluminum cans/containers. No Styrofoam, plastic grocery bags, or broken glass. If possible, be sure to compost those grass clippings, food scraps, and compostable paper products.

There are lots of resources available if you have questions. www.ecocycle.org has the A-Z Recycling Guide and information about hard to recycle items. The city of Longmont waste division page has a waste wizard search tool to assist in finding the answer to "What's the best way to dispose of this?" – Recycle, Compost, or Trash.
