District Governor Jacqueline Howard visits with the Breakfast Club

District Governor Jacqueline Howard spoke to the Breakfast Club last week to bring a message from the International President of Rotary, Holger Knaack. Holger asked her to stress the message of "Rotarians Open Opportunities" -- through leadership opportunities, service, and improving lives in need. Given all that we have been through in 2020, this new Rotary year will be a year of reinvention to adapt to the changes we have experienced. Key messages that Jacqueline passed on included: the need to consider innovative club models, such as expanding our reach through a satellite club or supporting a new Rotaract Club. She also stressed the importance of hosting at least one strategic management meeting each year, and visioning every three years. She reminded us of the importance of selecting new

members carefully, making sure they are a good fit, and then engaging them and taking care of them. Rotary International's new action plan will direct our work over the next five years, so we need to consider how we can build on each priority.

For example, we should work to increase our impact by becoming more involved in service projects, but also by measuring what we do and making more public the work that is accomplished; Jacqueline wanted us to know that if we achieve the Presidential Citation, we will be eligible for matching funds for next year's projects. She also talked about the importance of Peacebuilding Clubs throughout the world, explaining that our district is a Peacebuilder District. Should our club want to be a Peacebuilding Club, the District will match one membership (we only need two) and that will allow us to apply for funding for PeaceBuilder activities.

Jacqueline also discussed the importance of maintaining our commitment to Polio Plus, explaining that even though it is almost entirely eradicated, funds go to research and to support for infrastructure, but those funds can also be used in crisis situations, such as the Ebola outbreak or COVID.

She then talked about the importance of learning to tell our story, create more awareness, bring in members, expand engagement, and engage in partnerships. As President Holger says, "Rotary is not just a club you join; it's an invitation to endless opportunities." Some new ways to expand might be to support an eClub, a satellite club, or even one of the new ways younger members are getting involved, through eco-focused clubs.

Finally, Jacqueline invited us all to join her monthly Zoom meetings, which will focus on the theme of the month.
