## Club Gets Tips for Good Tree Care

Self-described "bug nerd" and forest entomologist Robbie Doerhoff gave club members some great tips to preserve and protect trees at last week's club meeting. Doerhoff, on the staff of the Missouri Department of Conservation, emphasized the importance of protecting a tree's critical root zone. A tree with a 20-inch diameter can have a wide, flat mat of roots more than forty feet in diameter. Chemicals, trenching, and other invasions of the root zone can impact the health of the tree.

Tree health is also affected by drought, herbicides, age, slope position, and insects. Water is the best chemical to put on trees, and when watering, be generous. Mulch rings keep out invaders, but don't heap into the dreaded "mulch volcano" that harms the tree. Be sure to prune trees properly at the branch "collar", or hire an arborist to do the job right. And once a tree begins to decline, no amount of effort will save it.
