Local Churches Seek to Provide Shelter & Hope for Homeless

A group of people from eight local churches have come together to provide transitional housing for the homeless, with the goal of helping them move toward a more stable and secure life. Reverend Mark Kiekhaefer, pastor of Living Hope Church and founder and board member of Transitional Housing, told club members last week of the tremendous lack of low-income rental housing in the community.

Rev. Kiekhaefer believes churches should be more actively engaged in the community. "God made us to give and serve," he said. Thanks to a generous donation from club member Bos Asahl, the non-profit group now owns a multi-family residence at 203 Cherry Street that they plan to renovate into a five-apartment building. Rent will be set according to the residents' income, and renters will be supported by church members who will coach them in life skills to move them toward independence. The group envisions residents living in the transitional housing from six to twelve months.

Rev. Kiekhaefer said work has already begun to renovate the 110-year-old building that had been damaged in a recent fire. He encouraged club members to lend their building talents to the effort, and support the group financially as well. For more information on the project, contact club member Jack Atterberry.



Rotary Spotlight: Stephen Stark

JCBRC member Stephen Stark has been a Rotarian for 20 years, but was first introduced to Rotary on a GSE team trip to Japan in 1999 led by Jay and Kathy Jordan. Stephen joined the club in 2001 and met Reg Turnbull, whose law firm he joined in 2004. Stephen now specializes in elder law.

Stephen grew up in small towns in northern Missouri, moving whenever his father, a grain elevator manager, received a promotion. Stephen went to college at St. Louis University, completing a degree in



social work, and then attended law school at the University of Missouri. After working for a law firm in St. Louis for two years, he took a position in Jefferson City with the Missouri Department of Insurance, prosecuting misbehaving insurance agents and insurance companies that failed their audits.

He and his wife Sheila share an interest in history, especially family history. Sheila has an ancestor who was a passenger on the Mayflower, and another who served in the Continental Congress. Stephen's fifth great grandfather was the mayor of Edinburgh, Scotland from 1843 to 1848; and he has ancestors who fought in both the Revolutionary War and the Civil War.
