## Todd Spalding Speaks to the Breakfast Club

Todd Spalding, Director of Jefferson City Parks and Recreation since 2016, presented to the Breakfast Club about the Department's recent projects. He said that when he started as Director, his top priority was equity--making sure that everyone has access to the city parks. The Department started with Lafayette Park, which serves up to 11,000 people, but which had very little equipment. They were able to add a splash park as well as new equipment and a new parking lot. The "grand opening" for this park will be in August. The second priority was McClung Park, which was built in 1960 and gets lots of use; it is currently under construction and will be finished in September. Riverside Park was the next project, focusing on the renovation of the amphitheater, which will seat 1500 when it is finished. Finally, Todd explained that a problem that needed addressing was flooding of the Master Gardener plots in North Jeff City. The plan is to move the community garden to Riverside Park, which has room for gardening, as well as beautiful views of the Missouri River. With the building of the new bridge, Todd wants to make sure that Riverside Park is in good shape. Todd ended his talk by pledging his commitment to our park system, which he says is one of the most important elements of any city for attracting and keeping people in a community.
