Michelle Gleba Speaks to the Club about the BBB

Michelle Gleba, Regional Director of the Better Business Bureau of Mid-Missouri, spoke to the Breakfast Club last week. She began by giving an overview of BBB nationally, and then explained that in Mid-Missouri, there are 600 BBB-accredited businesses, which are all committed to upholding the BBB standards. The Mid-Missouri BBB provided 13.4 million instances of service in 2019 alone, including providing information about businesses and charities to the public, sending out newsletters, investigating scams and unethical business practices, and providing support for businesses, among many other services. Michelle also explained how the business profiles work on the BBB website, which provides extensive information about both businesses and charities. She then discussed the extensive research that the BBB conducts regarding scams, and gave us a wealth of information. For example, women tend to fall for scams more often than men, and younger people tend to be scammed more often than older people (although older people tend to lose more when they do fall for a scam). She also said that one of four people fall to online shopping scams, so we need to be particularly careful while shopping online. During the pandemic, shopping scams have been particularly problematic, as well as employment scams and tech support scams. Michelle advised us to never pay to apply for a job, and don't trust a pop up ad that tells you that your computer needs to be fixed, since that's an easy way for someone to get all your personal information. Other typical scams are CEO scams (where you get a fake email from your boss), IRS or SSA scams, romance scams, and family emergency scams. If you have concerns about scams, an easy way to get information is to check the BBB Scam Tracker (<https://www.bbb.org/scamtracker/>).
