Club Fills Refugee Wish List

When Afghan refugees arrive in Missouri, the JCBRC will be ready to help. The club is hosting a "wish list" supply drive to provide needed items for new arrivals. Many refugees will arrive with little more than the clothing they are wearing. Items needed include:

Kitchen items: cereal bowls, rice cookers, teapots, can openers, cooking utensils, microwaves

Cleaning products: laundry detergent, brooms, mops and buckets, trash cans, vacuum cleaners

Personal items: toothbrushes and toothpaste, soap, shampoo, combs, new socks and underwear

General-use items: box fans, space heaters, alarm clocks, school supplies, flashlights, irons

Linens: clean and unstained blankets and sheets, new pillows and bath towels

Furniture: small living room chairs, cribs, strollers, clean unexpired car seats

The drive-through collection will be **September 18** at Building Community Bridges, 213 East Ashley, from **9 am to 2 pm**. Volunteers will be on hand to assist with unloading and handling donations. Donations will be delivered to St. Louis for distribution at a later date. Patriot Day to Mark 9/11 Anniversary

The 20th anniversary of the September 11, 2001 terrorists attacks will be marked in Jefferson City by a two-day series of events on the South Capitol lawn and downtown. Steve Cearlock, who organized the Patriot Day planning group, recently shared the details of the commemoration with JCBRC members.

Beginning at 7 pm on Friday, September 10, volunteers will read the names of all 2,977 people who died in the attacks. On Saturday, September 11, there will be a 5K run/walk with first responders, veterans, and active military wearing full firefighter gear and packs. At noon, a Patriot Day parade will begin at the corner of Broadway and High Streets. The parade will include bands, military units and first responders. Following the parade, the Missouri Division of Fire Safety will conduct a 9/11 Memorial Stair Climb inside the Jefferson Building.
