Construction Schedule Set for Rotary HH House

JCBRC members will get the chance to swing a hammer and pound some nails beginning Saturday, October 2 as Rotarians from all four local clubs begin construction on the Rotary Habitat for Humanity house. The house, located at 902 Jackson Street, is scheduled to be completed in the spring. It will become a four-bedroom home for a single Mom and her 12-year-old daughter.



Our club's construction shift will be the first Saturday of every month. Shifts will begin at 7:45 am and conclude about 1 pm. Work crews will be limited to 8 volunteers, plus a construction manager from River City Habitat for Humanity (RCHH). No experience is needed (which means I can volunteer) and all tools will be provided. Club members are also needed to provide drinks and snacks, and make reminder phone calls prior to each scheduled shift. Club members should have received an email from Kim Woodruff at RCHH last week with instructions for online registration. (Let us know if you did not receive that email !)

The River City chapter of Habitat for Humanity began in 1992, and has built 125 homes for low-income families in the community since then. Homes are typically three to four bedrooms and about 1,400 square feet. The home are sold with mortgages at 0 % interest for 25 years, with mortgage payments of about \$550 a month.

JCBRC treasurer Don Neumann was recently recognized by President Jon for completing his second Paul Harris Fellow designation with a lapel pin noting the milestone. The Paul Harris Fellow recognition acknowledges individuals who have contributed, or who have contributions made in their name, of \$1,000 to the Rotary Foundation. Rotary established the recognition in 1957 to encourage and show appreciation for substantial contributions to what was then the Foundation's only program, the Fellowship for Advanced Study, the precursor to Ambassadorial Scholarships. The number of Paul Harris Fellows world-wide reached the one million mark in 2006.
