Volunteers, Donations Needed for Refugee Collection Saturday

Members of the JCBRC will help organize a drive-through collection this Saturday, **September 18**, at Building Community Bridges, 213 East Ashley, from **9 am to 2 pm** for items destined to help new Afghan refugees get settled in Missouri.

Volunteers will be on hand to assist with unloading and handling donations. Donations will be delivered to St. Louis for distribution at a later date. To volunteer to help Saturday, call project chairman Nicole Slusser at 573-353-5466 or email to hnicole79@hotmail.com.

The club's "wish list" includes a variety of household items needed by the new arrivals. Many refugees will arrive with little more than the clothing they are wearing. Needed items include:

Kitchen items: cereal bowls, rice cookers, teapots, can openers, cooking utensils, microwaves

Cleaning products: laundry detergent, brooms, mops and buckets, trash cans, vacuum cleaners

Personal items: toothbrushes and toothpaste, soap, shampoo, combs, new socks and underwear

General-use items: box fans, space heaters, alarm clocks, school supplies, flashlights, irons

Linens: clean and unstained blankets and sheets, new pillows and bath towels

Furniture: small living room chairs, cribs, strollers, clean unexpired car seats

The world-wide PolioPlus campaign, began in 1985, has eradicated more than 99.9 % of the disease across the globe. However, because most of the conditions that cause polio to spread still exists, health care providers around the world continue to work to keep the disease in check. Rotary's efforts to provide clean drinking water, bed nets, and soap through the PolioPlus program are helping to eliminate the underlying conditions that can spread disease.

The 2021 fund drive runs through the month of October. Our club's fundraising goal for this year is \$5,000. That's an ambitious goal, but we can get there!
