Club member Bob Reed is now accepting contributions to assist in *Rotary International's* campaign to eradicate polio from the world. Members can contribute by cash or check to Bob at any club meeting, or by mail. Please make checks payable to *The Rotary Foundation*, and include "PolioPlus" on the memo line.

The world-wide *PolioPlus* campaign, began in 1985, has eradicated more than 99.9 % of the disease across the globe. However, because most of the conditions that cause polio to spread still exists, health care providers around the world continue to work to keep the disease in check. Rotary's efforts to provide clean drinking water, bed nets, and soap through the *PolioPlus* program are helping to eliminate the underlying conditions that can spread disease.

The 2020 fund drive runs from now to the end of October. For every dollar club members contribute, the *Gates Foundation* will match with \$2. Our club's fundraising goal for this year is \$2,750. We have exceeded that amount many times before, so let's do it again !
