Capitol Facelift Nears Completion

Breakfast Club members learned last week that the 30-month, \$30 million restoration of the State Capitol is nearing completion, with the project set to be wrapped up next month. Michael Qutami,project manager for the Missouri Office of Administration; and Bill Ahal, president of Ahal Preconstuction Services; briefed club members on the details of the once-in-a-lifetime restoration of the century -old building.

The project to protect and preserve the historic aspects of the building's exterior is being funded by state revenue bonds authorized by the legislature in 2016. Work began in March of 2018. After completion of the project by year's end, the Capitol's exterior should be serviceable for another 50 to 100 years. The project is the largest restoration effort on the building since it was constructed.

Although only approximately six percent of the exterior stone was replaced, the process was expensive and time-consuming. Using drones and inspectors who rappelled down the walls, stones in need of replacement and repair were identified. Each stone was numbered and the condition inventoried. Engineers looked to match the Carthage marble (actually a limestone material) used in the original construction as closely as they could. They found a good replacement in a quarry north of Springfield, where large slabs were cut vertically and sent to be individually fabricated at a facility in Chicago.

The restoration project also involved many so-called "dutchman" repairs is which the face of a damaged stone was taken off and a replacement facade was mortared and screwed into place on the base of the old stone. So that workers could clean stone and set mortar year-round, the scaffolding that surrounded the entire building was wrapped in plastic sheeting to allow the space to be heated and cooled.

Other aspects of the project involved replacing terrace and sidewalk pavers, repairs to the flashing and copper roof, and an extensive cleaning of the goddess Ceres statue on top of the Capitol which had been stuck by lighting more than 300 times during its nearly 90 years over the dome.


