What time is the event?

6 pm or until all 10 games of Bingo are played

Who can attend?

Anyone! Rotarians, friends, family members, neighbors can play for the fun and to raise money to eradicate Polio.

How do I get Bingo cards?

You can purchase Bingo cards in person during a meeting from Julia Prullage 573-544-3551 or juliaprullage@gmail.com or Patrick Prenger 573-301-8690 or patrick.prenger@countryfinancial.com. Or you can Email, Call or Text to purchase and have delivered.

How do you play Bingo?

You will need Bingo cards, and a highlighter or marker in order to keep track.

The Bingo announcer at the start of each game will give explanations of this rounds game. So, for example: Round 1 could be all numbers in a straight vertical line, all numbers under the letter B. Bingo announcer will call which bingo ball has been drawn, players will check their cards and highlight/mark if it is on the card. When someone has Bingo they will shout out Bingo either out loud or use the chat button. A prize will be awarded after each game. Members can steal a winning Bingo card by claiming it for \$25. More than one member can steal the same card. All money from stolen cards will go to Polio Foundation in the club's name.

How will winner be determined? Will someone be checking be checking bingo cards to confirm winners?

Using the 4 Way Test we will be determining winners on the honor system since this is event will have some members playing via Zoom.

How can players "Steal the Winning Bingo?"

After a player has the necessary squares to complete the Bingo and yelled "BINGO" other players now have the chance to tell the Bingo Announcer that they are going to "steal" the winning bingo card. In order to do so the Bingo Thief i.e.. the one stealing the winning card, will need to donate \$25 to do so. Any other player may steal the winning card from the first Bingo Thief again for \$25. The final holder of the card will take home the prize for that round of bingo.

Money collected from the stealing the winning bingo cards will be donated to RI Polio in the club's name.

Are there any prizes to be won?

Of Course! What game of chance doesn't have a prize? Prizes will be awarded one for each of the 10 games. So of the prizes are:

How does the Point Swap portion work?

Your Paul Harris Contribution Point amounts will be sent to you by Steve Dinolfo and Jim Keller our Foundation Chairs via email. Donations to Rotary Foundation or Polio earn members Paul Harris Points. These donation points sole use is for the member to donate to others.

You can swap points to reach your next level of Paul Harris before or during the party. Points must be exchanged in a minimum of 100 points.

We suggest that points be swapped for \$1 per point. So, if you currently have 600 Paul Harris Recognition points you will need a combination of points and money to equal 1000 for the next Paul Harris. If a member has 200 points to give or swap for \$200, you will have the necessary money to reach the next Paul Harris. Any necessary paper work can be done after the party either in person or via email.
