Linthacum Updates Club on JCPS Operations

Administering a school district that includes 18 schools and almost 9,000 students during a pandemic is certainly a challenge, but one that the *Jefferson City School District* is handling well, according to Dr. Larry Linthacum. Linthacum, school superintendent since 2015, recently briefed Breakfast Club members on school operations amid the Covid-19 virus outbreak

Staffing each of the schools is the biggest challenge, since without adequate teachers to cover each classroom, schools must go virtual

despite the health of the student body. Recently, both *Thomas Jefferson* and *Lewis & Clark* Middle Schools went virtual because of a shortage in the district's nearly 1,500 staff members, as well as a lack of needed substitute teachers.

Each school day, temperature checks are taken using a thermal imaging device that can scan up to 30 students at a time. The schools also use social distancing, masks, and other protocols recommended by the *CDC* and the *Cole County Health Department*. On an average day, about 7,500 students are in-seat, with another 1,500 choosing to attend on-line.

Linthacum also noted that next year will be the first time that the new *Capital City High School* will have all four grades, from freshman to senior, under the roof. He said that one of the many benefits of adding a second high school has been that more students are getting involved in extra-curricular activities, finding more opportunities to get engaged.

He also said that the purchase of the 51 properties near *Jefferson City High School* that had been hit by the tornado will allow the school to build soccer and baseball fields, as well as tennis courts, that otherwise would not have been possible on the land-locked school campus.

Club Scholarships Expanded to Include Tech Schools

The board of directors has voted to expand eligibility for the Breakfast Club's college scholarships to include technical and professional schools such as *State Technical College of Missouri*, and two-year community college programs; in addition to four-year college and university programs.



The club now awards four, \$1,000 scholarships; two to *Jefferson City High School* seniors and one each to *Helias* and *Calvary Lutheran* students. In 2022, one of the JCHS scholarships will be re-directed to

a senior in the first graduating class at *Capital City High School*. Criteria for selecting a recipient of the award is based on academic achievement, community service, financial need, student involvement, and international interest. Children and family members of Breakfast Rotary Club members are not eligible.
