Brian will be joining us on September 10th to discuss the opportunity to host an exchange student currently in Springfield from Brazil. Brian's family has been a host family in the past and his son was an exchange student in Spain. He has seen first hand what a life changing and positive experience this program is for our youth. Each student stays with three different host families during their stay.

Rotary Youth Exchange builds peace one young person at a time.

Students learn a new language, discover another culture, and truly become global citizens. Exchanges for students ages 15-19 are sponsored by Rotary clubs in more than 100 countries.

What are the benefits?

Exchange students unlock their true potential to:

- Develop lifelong leadership skills
- Learn a new language and culture
- Build lasting friendships with young people from around the world
- Become a global citizen

How long do exchanges last?

Long-term exchanges last a full academic year, and students attend local schools and live with multiple host families.

Short-term exchanges last from several days to three months and are often structured as camps, tours, or homestays that take place when school is not in session.

Vocational Study Exchange to D4355 in Chile

The team leader must be a Rotarian, but the team members may be Rotarians, Rotaractors or non-Rotarians over the age of 25. All travel and accommodations in Chile are fully funded by the Rotary Foundation block grant to our district. The application deadline is November 11 and interviews conducted by our Committee later in November.
