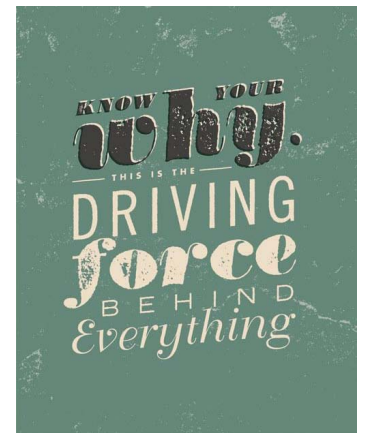
Join us at Springfield Metro Rotary on July 6, 2021 to dig into the discussion
