February 11, Lisa Engel and Robyn Havener delivered Valentines cards to nursing homes.



Funding was also for food supply and eviction remediation. In our area there were 103 Ioan applications, 97 total Ioans completed with 84% to small business in BA. 1/2 million was delivered to non-profits.


