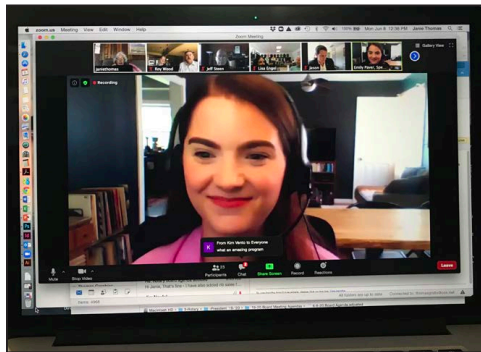

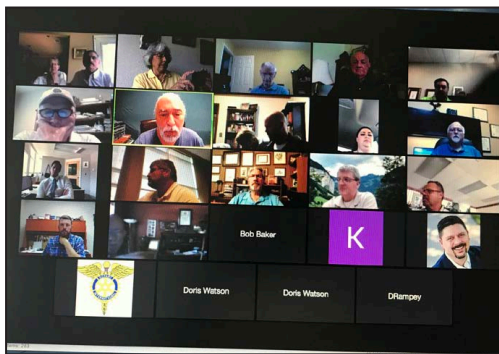

June 8 Zoom meeting



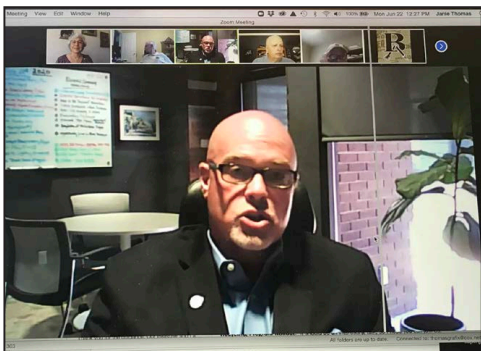

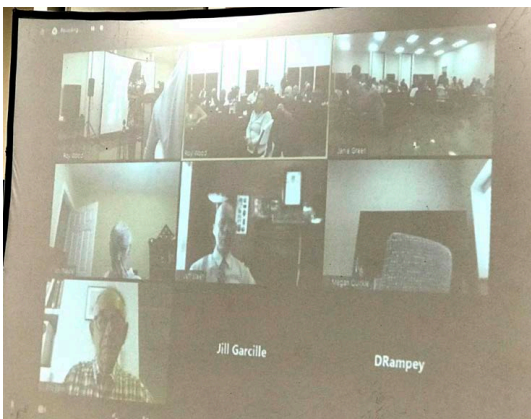
