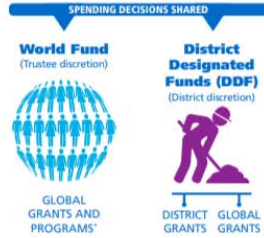

**Topics:** Communications, Membership, Public Image, Youth Service, RI Programming, The Rotary Foundation, and District 6110

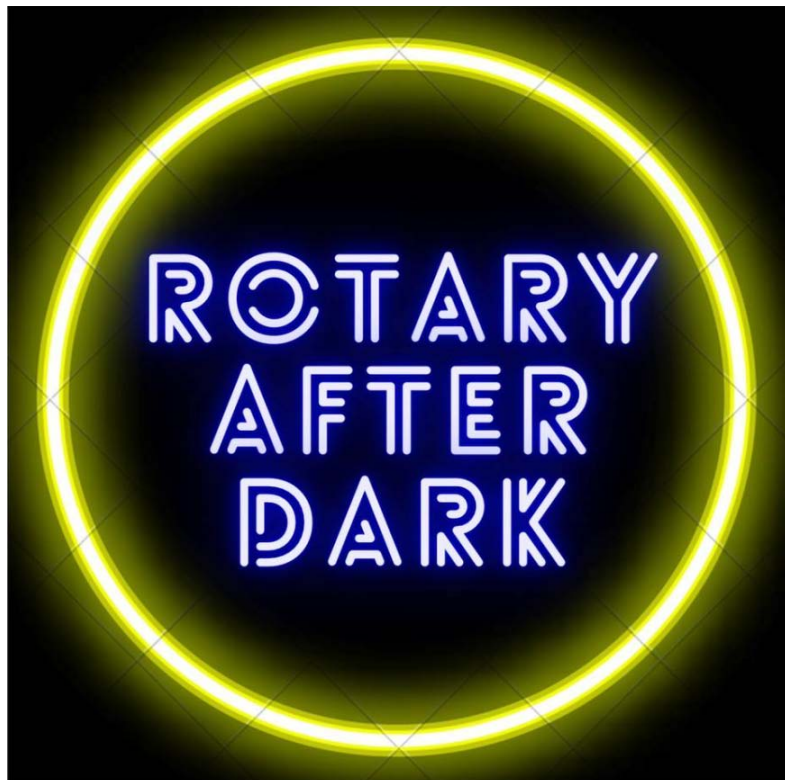
**Cost:** \$100—Club leadership is encouraged to refund participants upon graduation as an investment for the future.

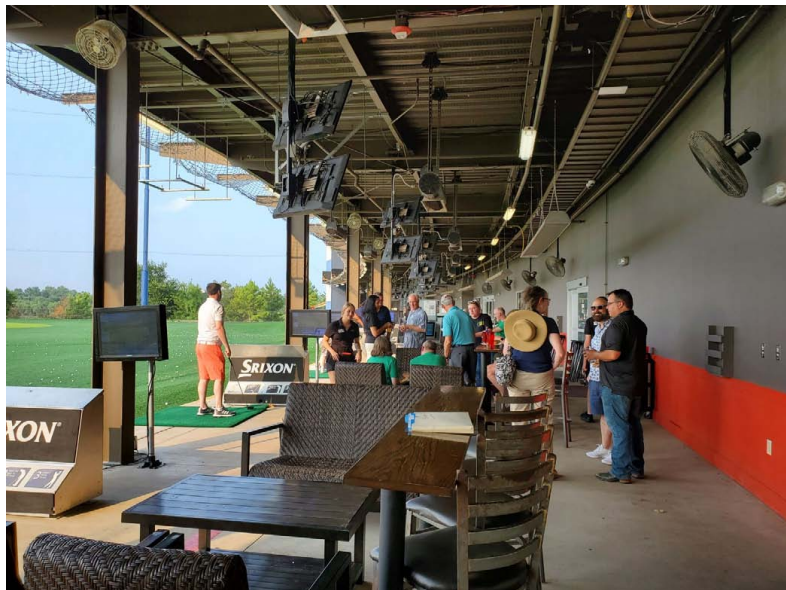
