Program: Chris Beach - Tulsa Cornerstone Assistance Network & YouthWorks

Chris Beach was born in Syracuse, New York. He is executive director of Tulsa Cornerstone Assistance Network and oversees the YouthWorks initiative including the 10-week Summer Dream Camp, 30-week after school program, YouthWorks Pizza Factory, and the Thunder Court Basketball Outreach built by the OKC Thunder NBA team.

Chris is also co-pastor of Wesley Chapel, one of the 13 churches burned down in what is historically known as the 1921 Tulsa Race Riot, more recently called the Tulsa Race Massacre. Each Sunday the church ministers to more than 100 homeless men and women, as well as the kids and moms from North Tulsa apartment complexes. They conduct homeless weddings every week and baby showers for low income moms each month.

Chris is also cofounder of several city-wide ministries in Tulsa to equip churches to help the poor including Good Samaritan Health Services and Community Sharehouse, the Furniture Bank of Tulsa County.

Chris and his wife Anna have been married 25 years and have had 25 children in their home. Together, they oversee YouthWorks Ranch, a 20-acre farm with a 12,000 square-foot hydroponic plant to empower foster children and the children of North Tulsa to bless families in the community with nutritious food. Chris lives to glorify God and accomplishes all he does through the Lord ♦ guidance, strength and encouragement.

ROTARY FOUNDATION CORNER

Polio eradication is Rotary s top philanthropic priority.

Rotary launched the PolioPlus program in 1985.

In 1988, when Rotary began working with its partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, there were more than 350,000 polio cases in over 125 countries.

Since then, nearly **3 billion children** have been immunized against polio, and the incidence of polio has decreased **99.9%**.

As of 2020, Rotary s contributions to the global polio eradication effort, including matching funds from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, exceeded \$2 billion.

The son of a stonemason, who built the family home with his own hands, Germ developed his work ethic early in life. Nothing came easily. Other schoolboys made fun of his name ♦ they called me ♦Bacteria♦ ♦ ♦ and his parents couldn♦t afford college tuition. After a stint in vocational school, he paid his way through the University of Tennessee at Knoxville by working in a machine shop and serving food in a dorm cafeteria. After graduating, he joined the U.S. Air Force. Soon promoted to captain, he was navigator on a 50-ton Douglas C-124, ferrying troops and tanks to Vietnam. You will not want to miss his keynote on Friday, Sept 17.

The fun continues Saturday as DisCon21 gears up. John Germ will speak at the opening breakfast meeting, and continue to inspire all of us. Much of the day Saturday will provide guided opportunities to learn from other fellow Rotarians about all the elements of Rotary. An update on PolioPlus in Afghanistan from Michael McGovern, Rotary International PolioPlus Committee Chair:

Eradicating Polio in Afghanistan

As the sun rose on 1 January 2021, we all worried about what this new year would bring. For those of us who closely follow polio eradication progress, it was an especially worrisome time. 2020 and 2019 had seen an uptick in wild polio virus cases and in circulating vaccine derived cases. Polio vaccinations had had to be suspended for a while in 2020 due to the coronavirus and vaccines for Covid-19 were just starting to receive early use approvals.

The polio news was especially bad in Afghanistan. On the very first day of 2021, a wild polio virus case was reported. In the next week, the national health minister was fired due to hints of corruption on non-polio matters. Before month's end, the government of Afghanistan ordered the UNICEF polio lead to leave the country relating to a verbal spat that had occurred in the President's office. Then in March and June there were coordinated attacks on polio workers and their security teams leaving eight families having lost loved ones. The Taliban denied responsibility for the attacks, and it appeared the attacks were tied to elements who supported ISIS or ISIL as they are also known. We also noted that some areas of the country had been subject to over 30 months of a ban on house-to-house polio vaccinations.

While all this was going on other activities were occurring which have been mostly unreported. On January 17th, the Regional Directors of WHO and UNICEF met at the Taliban office in Doha, Qatar to discuss polio vaccinations and covid response in the areas controlled by the Taliban. While house to house polio vaccinations were not agreed to, the seven senior members of Taliban leadership indicated support for other measures to provide vaccination activities. In all areas of the country, health screenings continued unabated which showed no new wild polio cases and no positive identification of polio viruses in the environment. In a zoom call of polio partnership leaders the week of 17 August, Aidan O'Leary, the global WHO polio director, noted that Afghanistan has one of the best programs for polio surveillance in the world and it was not finding polio anywhere.

After the fall of the Afghanistan government in mid-August, the new leadership has agreed to keep on the acting health minister who has been effective in righting the program since February. Taliban leaders have visited the national and regional polio offices and pledged

their support for the polio eradication program. On 23 August, a Rotary sponsored roadside vaccination hut provided vaccinations to children under five with local Taliban providing the needed security. For security reasons, I will not share the photos I received but it was good to see the Rotary logo doing good in the world.

Rotary has just 35 members in Afghanistan. They inspire me daily with their courage and perseverance. The polio program has always been politically neutral in every country. Rotary and our partners work with the leaders who are in charge. We now work with new leaders in Afghanistan. Rotary funds WHO and UNICEF. We do not send any funds to the governments nor to groups other than WHO and UNICEF. We monitor the spending they do on our behalf very closely. We have never been closer to eradicating polio in Afghanistan. We will continue to work with the Afghani people and our partners to finish what we began over 35 years ago.
