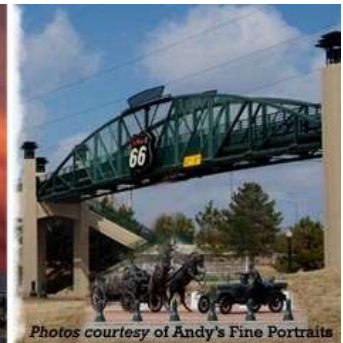

### Last Week's Program

Jack Freese was Rotarian of the Day and gave a great introduction of our speaker, Neal Pascoe, Education Director of the Tulsa Historical Society. Neal presented a wonderful PowerPoint, Art Deco 101, with amazing pictures of the Art Deco history of Tulsa taken by David Halpern. Tulsa is internationally known for the number of buildings built here during that period.

In 1893 oil was discovered in and around Tulsa and Tulsa became the Oil Capital of the World. The wealth generated from the oil allowed Tulsa to build and create much of the art deco in the city. It was reflected not only in the architecture of the time, but in clothing, jewelry, furniture, lighting, appliances and interior design. Terra cotta was the most popular medium of Art Deco architecture.



There were three predominant styles which are still represented in Tulsa today:

ZigZag – Boston Avenue Church, Christ the King Church are two of the remaining examples.

Unfortunately, we have torn down over 1/2 of the buildings of this style.

WPA - These were larger buildings. Examples were our original airport (at the time, the busiest in the USA!), Fire Alarm Building, Union Bus Terminal, Fairgrounds Building, Will Rogers High School.

Streamlined – Examples are Webster High School, Lerner Store, Whitlock's, Delman and Will Rogers Theatres, the Mayo parking sign and many neon signs of the period, City Veterinary Hospital, Mausoleum Building, Silver Castle Hamburgers, KVOO Radio and a few homes (some by Frank Lloyd Wright) which were very expensive and featured elegant bathrooms, niches and playrooms for the kids.
