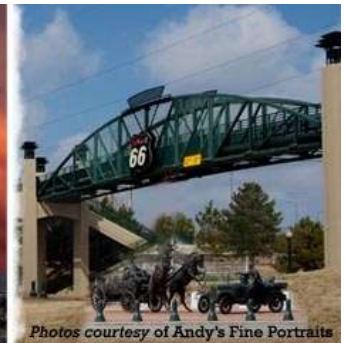

Last Week's Program

Shannon Beeler is a 21 year veteran of Junior Achievement and is currently the President of Junior Achievement of Oklahoma. JA turns 100 this year. It was founded because the founders felt that high school graduates were not prepared to go to work. JA is not a United Way program and receives no government funding. It was founded in Springfield, Mass and the first JA program in Oklahoma was started in 1966. Their programs moved into the classrooms in the 1970's. Prior to that, all of their programs were exclusively after school. In the 1980's, JA was one of the first organizations to bring computers into the schools. The Oklahoma headquarters was built in 2002 and they keep it looking like new. Over 62,000 students participated in JA programs this year. That involved 4,273 volunteers and over 2,500 teachers. Their three pillars are: Entrepreneurship, Work Readiness, and Financial Literacy. And we ran out of time. There was just too much to tell, so we hope Shannon will come back.
