Students Helping Students

Our speaker, Sarah Hall, was the president of the Student Philanthropy Council for the 2019-2020 school year. The Student Philanthropy Council was established in 2016 and quickly became one of the top three organization on the ASU campus. It focuses on service with an emphasis on giving. To be a member, a student must meet the following requirements:

- Be a full-time undergraduate student at Arkansas State University
- Be in good standing with the university
- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5
- Attend monthly meetings
- Dedicate 15-20 hours of service to the organization each semester

The SPC participates in many campus activities, such as Back the Pack, give a howl, the Philantropy Cup Committee, donors and scholars, Create AState, Gradstock, and Butterfly Trail. It helps organizations raise funds. It helps to instill spirit.

One of the projects SPC does is provide financial aid to students with the Student Emergency Fund. This fund was started in 2016. It awards up to \$500 to students experiencing a financial emergency which will impact their future studies at ASU. Tuition and fees are not applicable. The student must be willing to take part in a financial literacy course.

Some reasons the SEF has given financial aid are as follows:

- to a single mother
- to a student whose house has burned down
- · to help a student who had to travel to school
- to a student whose laptop had broken
- to a student whose textbooks were stolen
- to a student who lost his home to the tornado
- to students who had to transition to online due to COVID-19
- to a student who lost his/her job due to COVID-19

The Student Emergency Fund is 100% crowdfunded. It mainly gets donations when it sells t-shirts.
