## Last Week's Program, June 16, 2020

Dr. Shane Speights returned to give us an update on COVID-19.

He began with giving us a global view of the virus. France moved forward with reopening. However, reopening for them meant that one person in the household could leave the home for one hour per day. South Korea had an increase in cases. And, China shut down Beijing due the another outbreak. This virus was a different strain from the one that occurred there in the fall of 2019.

In the United States, 21 states have increasing number of cases, 20 states have decreasing number of cases, and 12 states have stayed level in term of new cases. Overall, deaths are on the decline.

Arkansas has begun Phase 2 of reopening. This means that handwashing is still recommended, a 6-foot social distancing is encouraged, face masks are encouraged but not required, restaurants are now at 66% capacity, there are no travel restrictions in the state, indoor venues now have up to 100 attendees, and places of worship

are encouraged to have services online but children's programs can resume. The take home is that going out in public requires personal responsibility. There is concern by the public as to whether reopening is too soon. The good news is that in the senior group, people are taking the precautions seriously.

A letter from Washington Regional Medical Systems in northwest Arkansas stated that they were seeing an increase in infections by the virus. This is not due to increased testing.

We have learned more about the virus since its outbreak. We are not so quick in putting people on ventilators. We know to protect our healthcare workers. We've learned not to dry out those patients in ICU. We limit narcotic use. Patients who are hospitalized need human contact.

The vaccine will be available the earliest by December of this year but only to a limited number of patients. It still will be spring of 2021 before we have a vaccine for the public.

There are some unintended consequences of coronavirus. Concentrating to slow the virus spreads other diseases.

People are tired of the coronavirus and seemingly have given up on the pandemic. They want freedom to choose how much they do to prevent spread of the virus. However, the virus is not finished.


