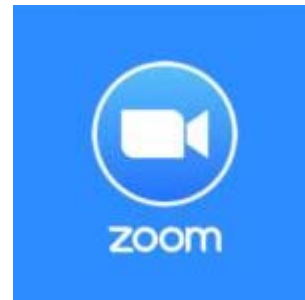

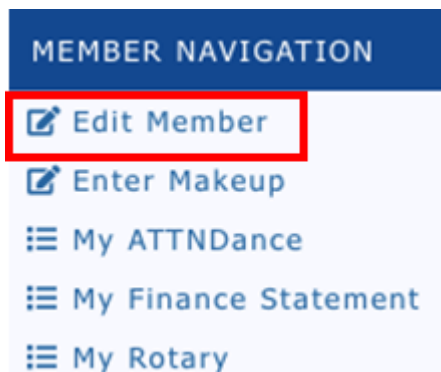
## Updating Your Phone Number in DACdb

## July 5, 2020 Pedal Power to End Polio

On July 5, 2020, Rotary Past District Governor Nick Hall, a member of the Rotary Club of Tampa Carrollwood, Florida in Rotary District 6890 passed through Jonesboro as he is making his third solo cross country bicycle trip. This time he's traveling 3,216 miles from Seattle to Tampa, FL to raise money for Rotary's Polio Eradication effort. This gave members of our club the opportunity to visit with and learn about his journey. The portion of Nick's coast to coast journey through Arkansas started as he crossed the Missouri / Arkansas border at Mammoth Spring, AR and ended at the Mississippi River in Memphis a distance of 157 miles. ## Last Week's Program, July 7, 2020



At our last online meeting of the Rotary Club of Jonesboro, Rotarian **Dr. Kelly Damphousse**, Chancellor of Arkansas State University, focused on resuming on-campus instruction for the Fall 2020 semester known as **Return to Learn**. Teaching, Learning, and Discovery is but one of seven parts of A-State's COVID-19 Continuity Task Force.

Classes will have a flexible mode of delivery; special needs will be available for labs, hands on activities, and clinical experiences; a plan must be in place for a second wave of COVID-19; and the Thanksgiving option will be available for last-minute changes to the fall schedule.

Students and faculty will allow for social distancing in classrooms, library, and meeting rooms; tape has already been laid out to indicate safe distances. All students will be required to wear masks on campus. The university will furnish face shields for faculty to facilitate understanding. Move-in day will be held over a series of days to relieve congestion. Residence life will allow for spreading out as much as possible. Testing and tracking of the virus will be available on campus. Football games will be held, but attendance at football games is still not decided.

There are other parts of the COVID-19 Continuity Task Force which deal with employees and community. AState receives guidance from the Center for Disease Control (CDC), the governor of Arkansas, the Arkansas Department of Health, and local health authorities.

More information is available on the A-State's website, coronavirus link. A-State's COVID-19 response remains flexible, and it is expected to remain a work in progress.

Dr. Damphousse stressed that A-State is committed to ensuring that the health and safety of our faculty, staff, and students is the highest priority, while also seeking to continue delivering the highest quality learning and working environment possible.
