## Helping Others with Plasma Donation

Rotary Opens Opportunities

Diana Howze, Jonesboro Center Manager at BPL Plasma, will be our program this week. She says, "Researchers have identified a protein and antibodies in the [convalescent] plasma that can help with the treatment."

While there isnot a cure for the coronavirus yet, those who have beaten the virus can help others fight the infection by donating plasma, shortly after being asymptomatic.

Donating plasma can be a life-saver. Plasma is needed for a majority of medical therapies. Now, plasma from someone who has recovered from COVID-19 can potentially be used to fight the infection.

People who have fully recovered from COVID-19 have antibodies in their plasma that can attack the virus. This convalescent plasma is being evaluated as treatment for patients with serious or immediately life-threatening COVID-19 infections, or those judged by a healthcare provider to be at high risk of progression to severe or life-threatening disease.

## Last Week's Program, July 21, 2020



Kim Wilbank, superintendent of Jonesboro Public Schools, gave the program last week on how school will progress for this fall.

Students will be given the choice of attending classes virtually or on campus. The classes provided virtually will be on a purchased curriculum because the school is not equipped to go virtually on their own. Students not choosing the virtual setting will received a blended instruction. They will have some classwork on site and some remotely.

Masks are mandated by the state and students will be required to wear masks in school. The masks will be provided by the school, along with hand sanitizer. Social distancing will be followed, except on buses where it is not required.

Safety is foremost. The guidelines for what to do when someone tests positive for COVID-19 depends on surrounding circumstances and therefore there is not a flat rule dictating what happens. As an example, if a teacher tests positive, she must determine if the contact was for 15 minutes or more and whether the parties were six feet apart. The teacher may be allowed to provide instruction from home or from campus, depending on the answers to specific questions. There are lots of situations and the outcome depends on the circumstances surrounding the contact. Each case will be judged individually.

On August 11 at Don Riggs Gymasium, there will be a restructuring of bonds. If it passes, the school can get up to 20 million dollars for projects.
