Club Operations -

♦ Club Administration: Net expense for the year \$452.10 for the fall picnic.

♦ Membership: Income included \$22,307.80 in dues and a \$418.06 reimbursement from the Satellite Club. Total expenses were \$11,505.26, mostly consisting of District dues of \$2,870 and

RI dues of 7,642.91.

◆ Operations: Income totaled \$6,663.81, mostly from raffle ticket sales, Happy Dollars, and merchandise sales. Expenses totaled 16,380.83, with the top four expense items being meeting expense, two 50/50 winners, annual awards, and storage locker rent.

◆ Public Relations: Spent \$756.61 on brochures, the member directory, and a 50th anniversary event.

◆ RI Foundation: Had \$60 in administrative expenses. Sent the Foundation \$3,905 in quarterly donations and \$174 in other donations

◆ Ended the year with \$18,205.10 in the bank.

Charity Corporation -

◆ Fund raising produced a net income of \$13,826.82. Birthday checks contributed \$2,855 to that income. We have had to refund \$1,400 of the bus trip income because of the changed date. Also, we had an up-front cost of \$1,600 for the 50th Anniversary beach party we were planning to host. At this time, we don't know whether that expense will produce any income, and if so, when.

◆ We spent a net 25,861.58 on charity projects during the year. The biggest amounts were \$15,145 for local grants, \$5,000 for scholarships, \$1,335 for Ak-Tenamit, and \$1,300 to help restore the Veterans Memorial. All of our district grant funds and the spring portion of local grants went to Covid-19 relief needs in our community.

◆ Ended the year with \$20,934.21 in the two bank accounts.
