### Hot Springs Memorial Field



Airport Director, Glen Barentine, shared history and current information about Hot Springs Memorial Field. Originally purchased as the Chamber of Commerce Airfield of Hot Springs in the 1920s, the airport was re-dedicated as Memorial Field in 1947 to honor the World War II veterans. Today, the Airport serves our area with more than 38,000 operations per year. Private air traffic is increasing annually here with the draw of Oaklawn, Camp Ozark, business and recreational travel. Camp Ozark attracts private aircraft from all over the world, with one coming in annually from Venezuela. Recently, there were 10 planes parked at the airport with a value in excess of \$4 billion just for the camp alone! Efforts continue to add commercial flights to Memphis to add to the current flights to Dallas. Barentine says that Hot Springs Memorial Field continues to grow because of the appeal of Hot Springs.
