Did you know that even thinking about generosity and giving back can boost your immunity? Did you also know that being generous with your attention can reduce your risk of heart attack? Cardiac arrest is highly correlated with the amount of self-reference ("1," "me," "my") in a person's speech. People suffering from chronic pain reported decreased intensity, and less disability and depression, when they reach out to others in pain - endorphins are

produced when you feel empathy. Studies also show you sleep better at night and it has cognitive benefits - those with a greater sense of purpose scored better on memory and cognitive function. One piece of research showed that older individuals who volunteered for at least 200 hours a year decreased their risk of hypertension by a whopping 40 percent. This could be because they were provided with more social opportunities, which help relieve loneliness and the stress that often accompanies it. And finally doing good for others can help you live longer - volunteers show an improved ability to manage stress and stave off disease as well as reduced rates of depression and an increased sense of life satisfaction. So, this all goes to show you that Rotary so motto of Service Above Self is not just three words made up, you can rest assured that the work we all do for others will help to make us all

happy, healthy and live longer lives.

Ancient wisdom and modern science seem to agree: Being part of something larger than ourselves might be one of the best things we can do, both for others and ourselves. As this quote by Gordon Hinckley goes � The happiest people I know are those who lose themselves in the service of others. Helping others can be a cure, not just for those who are in need, but for your soul as well.

The Four-Way Test is really the Golden Rule spelled out: \diamond do unto others as you would have them do unto you. \diamond

John Dean, who worked for and helped Richard Nixon resign as President, addressed a Kansas Rotary District Conference in 2003 and applied the Four-Way Test to Watergate. Dean said, �had those of us in the Nixon White House stopped to apply the Four-Way test, there would have been no Watergate. In short, the Four-Way Test works. Let us as Rotarians be diligent to make daily choices remembering our Four-Way Test.

Major General Lew Lyle was a distinguished member of our club for several years after he retired from the US Air Force. As a combat pilot with impeccable credentials, he had qualified as a bombardier during Would War II. Walter Cronkite was a war correspondent and a passenger on one of the planes � a B-17 Flying Fortress � crossing the coast of France on D-Day. He recorded some of his experiences. The lead aircraft that day was piloted

by Capt. L. E. Daub with then Lt. Col. Lew Lyle as the bombardier. To ensure the best possible bombing patterns, Lew decided to lead the mission from behind the Norden Bombsight instead of from the left seat on the flight deck. This was history in the making and the beginning of the end of World War II.

Thanks to all who made the sacrifice of themselves on that horrendous day **�** D-Day.
