District Governor, Kathy Carter



Assistant District Governor and Past President Michelle Ratcliff introduced our special guest speaker, District Governor Kathy Carter from Arkandelphia. Having met with the HSNP Board of Directors prior to the club meeting, Governor Kathy said that she was "overwhelmed and highly impressed" with our leadership. The Governor went on to tell us her personal story of being diagnosed with polio when she was five years old.

Health Organization to get the vaccines out to the world, when she was a guest at a Rotary Club years ago, she immediately decided to join and become an active part of this worldwide movement. Joining 1.2 million Rotarians who contribute and participate with the Polio Plus program, Polio Plus has been instrumental in the fact that active cases around the world of polio now stand at 2... yes two. But studies have shown that it would only take 10 years of non-vaccinated children for the virus to return. Rotary International initiatives this year remain with polio but also with girl's and women's health issues. In many impoverished countries, there are no sanitary conditions for young girls who have reached puberty. For these girls, if they do not have facilities at schools, they must go home; either missing vital days of education or even quitting school altogether. This is considered now to be "period poverty". Even in the US over 42 million impoverished women and girls do not have access to hygiene materials. As Mr. Rogers is quoted, "If it is mentionable, it is manageable". And "period poverty" is definitely mentionable.

Grateful for the Salk vaccine and knowing that Rotary partnered with the World

Through our Rotary Foundation (which is your monthly or annual TRF contribution), dollars are being donated to help this situation across the world. Our International President Shekhar Mehta, as well as our District Governor Kathy Carter, are placing emphasis this year on "Serving to Change Lives" and to focus their efforts on empowering girls and ensuring their access to education, resources, services, and opportunities so that future generations of women leaders will have the tools they need to succeed. Governor Carter highly encouraged us to "serve to change lives" and to be "change makers".
