After thanking members for their expressions of love and condolence over the passing of his wife, he led our assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. Monsignor Patrick Meylor provided the invocation.

We were able to note (but not celebrate with a song in their absence) the birthdays of member Bill Bode (November 20) and Rita Makal, wife of member Bill Makal, also on November 20.

We also noted two wedding anniversaries: Mike and Roberta Mitchell observed 42 years on November 16 and Gerv and Bev Rose will mark 58 years on November 22! A combined century of wedded bliss!!

Two Rotary anniversaries were called out: John Sebald, who now has one year under his belt, and Peter Skanavis, who expressed surprise that we have tolerated him for 8 years!

Our program chair for the day, Pat Meylor, introduced our speaker, Mr. Dave Swanson, former Assistant Director of Admissions at Northwestern University.

As a public speaker for more than 40 years, Dave owed much of his success to Elizabeth Gibson, his Wauwatosa East speech teacher. He was awarded a scholarship to attend Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois. After a three-year stint in the Navy, he went to work for Manpower, eventually becoming a manager working with the New York Stock Exchange.

Eventually, Dave went to work in the admissions department of his *alma mater*. He found many highly qualified highschool students in Wauwatosa, Brookfield, and Oconomowoc. With tuition, room, and board today set between \$60 and \$70 thousand per year, higher education at Northwestern is big business, and helping students to be successful means that they will persist and graduate. Every student who drops out represents a significant loss in revenue to the University.

As part of his work with students, Dave used Richard Bolles best-selling book, What Color is Your Parachute? With over 10,000,000 copies sold, it was judged by the New York Times as one of the top 25 most influential self-help books ever written. Using the book as a guide, Mr. Swanson has given over 1,500 talks on college and university campuses as he strives to impart the message: Know who you are, know your skills, know what you want to do.
