

"StoveTeam is currently focusing on our Justa stove project in Guatemala. Our goal is to install 5,000 cookstoves into homes in the next 3 years. We are working on gathering club and district support to fund our efforts and would welcome any support from your club or advice on approaching your district. We are currently partnering with several clubs to structure a matching global grant."

Foundation News

We received the good news last week that our Club Foundation has officially been recategorized as a public charity by the IRS. Previously the Foundation was considered a "supporting organization of unspecified type", which made it difficult for some contributions to be made, especially from certain Donor Advised Funds. The "PC" designation should remove the difficulties and allow those DAFs to make qualifying charitable contributions to our Foundation. Kudos to Jeff Smith, who spearheaded the effort to make this happen.


