Dr. Esther Ngumbi Water Well

On March 4, Dr. Esther Ngumbi spoke to our club about Faulu Academy, a school in Kenya, which she and her parents started. On March 25, we celebrated the completion of Carl Burkybile s work drilling wells in Kenya, which was the largest Rotary project our district had ever undertaken. On that same day, we launched fundraising to drill a well at Esther s school since they have no source of running water for the school. In conjunction with the Rantoul Rotary Club, we were able to raise \$10,000 fairly easily and started drilling the well at the school. Then, we hit a road block and donations were at a standstill. An anonymous donor stepped up and said they would match donations up to \$4,250. That kickstarted the effort, and donations started coming in. We have

raised another \$2,356 since the match was announced.

In addition to a monetary donation for 4,250, the Anonymous Donor has given another 3900 to Esther 3800 s Well for a total of 8,150.

We have raised \$25,746 for Esther s Well and can start Phase II of the project. We need to raise another \$4,254 to finish the project, but we have a lot to be thankful for right now! Thanks to all of you who are making this dream a reality!


