All 9 locations staffed by Champaign Rotary were filled thanks to the tremendous support of Rotarians and their families. The donation total has not yet been finalized, but **Major Randall Summit** estimated that the collective effort of all area Rotary Clubs yielded at least \$29,300, which included \$27,300 in cash and checks and a \$2000 special donation.
