October 26, 2020: University of Illinois College of Fine + Applied Arts

Kevin Hamilton is a professor of new media in the University of Illinois School of Art and serves as Dean of the <u>College of Fine and Applied Arts</u>. Professor Hamilton is a native of South Carolina. He studied painting at Rhode Island School of Design and public art at MIT. He co-authored <u>Lookout America! The Secret Hollywood Film Studio</u> <u>at the Heart of the Cold War</u>, which explores the work and impact of Lookout Mountain Laboratory, the Hollywood-based Air Force film studio responsible for photographing and filming America's nuclear weapons tests.


