

- **Practitioners:** Our work fighting disease, providing clean water and sanitation, improving the health of mothers and children, supporting education, and growing local economies directly builds the optimal conditions for peaceful societies.
- **Educators:** Our Rotary Peace Centers have trained over 1,300 peace fellows to become effective catalysts for peace through careers in government, education, and international organizations.
- **Mediators:** Our members have negotiated humanitarian ceasefires in areas of conflict to allow polio vaccinators to reach children who are at risk.

Advocates: Our members have an integral role as respected, impartial participants during peace processes and in post-conflict reconstruction. We focus on creating communities and convening groups that are connected, inclusive, and resilient.

Wanted! Rotary District 6490 Administrative Assistant

Rotary District 6490 is announcing the job opening of an Administrative Assistant to replace Jane Chamberlain. After three years of excellent service, Jane has decided to retire from this position on June 30 at the end of this Rotary Year (although definitely not leaving Rotary!). She will be missed, but we hope to have someone selected in the next few months, so Jane will have plenty of time to help train our new Administrative Assistant.

We are looking for a master multi-tasker with excellent communication skills and an upbeat attitude. Candidates should be able to assist the District Governor by handling office tasks; providing polite and professional assistance via phone, mail, and e-mail; managing the district website; scheduling and managing breakout rooms for Zoom; and assisting with social media. They should be comfortable with computers, general office tasks and excel at both verbal and written communications. Most importantly, candidates should have a genuine desire to meet the needs of others.

This is a part-time position working an average of 15-20 hours per week, but each week will vary. Salary is based on experience. The Administrative Assistant reports to the District Governor.

Since the Rotary District does not have an office, this person will be expected to work out of his or her home. The district will reimburse expenses such as mileage to events,

ShelterBox - Rotary Impact Report

Did you know ShelterBox often responds in countries that have few, if any, Rotarians, or clubs? Sudan, as an example, is a country of 41 million people but only one Rotary Club with less than two dozen Rotarians. In Syria, where ShelterBox has been responding to families displaced by conflict since 2012, there is no Rotary. For these families, Rotary may just be a name on a box of aid, but that aid is impacting and improving living conditions for thousands, right now, who have received our winterized aid package, which included warm coats for children.


