This past Saturday (October 17) Fishers Rotarians completed the fifth ramp since completing the first of this calendar year on June 13th. (Editor note: the picture of the team from Oct 17 was unable to be uploaded, however the completed ramp picture on the left is from Oct 17).

Key Metrics for Our Club

- Five ramps in four months
- Sixteen (16) Rotarians participated in at least one build
   Eight (8) of these Rotarians participated in two or more builds
   Two (2) Rotarians participated in all five builds
- Fishers Rotarians (and our guests) contributed 216 hrs building ramps
- The average ramp length was 45 LF, at an average cost of \$1,592.00
