John Powell on the Cuban Missile Crisis...The Rest of the Story

This week's speaker is former Carmel Rotarian, John Powell. He is going to talk about the Cuban Missile Crisis.... The Rest of the Story. John was in the Air Force Reserves and was called to active duty October 28, 1962, for the Cuban Crisis. It wasn't until 2005, 57 years later, that military records in the United States, Cuba and the Soviet Union were declassified. He has spent the last several years doing research to find out what really happened. What he discovered was amazing, scary... how close we really came to a thermonuclear war.

BIO - John Powell John was born in Chicaco and moved to Indianapolis in the 1950s. He retired in 2005 after 40+ years in the field of Corporate Risk Management. He now spends time traveling with wife Peggy, an occasional round of golf, reading, building model ships and playing the piano.

John is an Eagle Scout and was a stand-out athlete in at both Lawrence Central and Earlham College. He joined the Indianapolis Downtown Rotary Club in 1976 and served as president in 2005. He has served Rotary in many capacities including Foundation Board and Assistant District Governor. He continues to assist with the Carmelfest Parade.

Other leadership positions include President of the Independent Insurance Agents of Greater Indianapolis. Member of the Executive Service Corp., Board of Trustees at St. Luke's UMC and Board member of Indiana Golden Gloves.

John has played squash for 25 years and qualified to play on the Hahn Cup Squash Teams, both singles and doubles. He received the IAC Fitzgerald Award (Sportsman of the Year).

He chaired the annual Dinner-Boxing event and was ringside announcer for both State Tournaments and the Pan Am Games with aired on ABC. John has also served as an Ambassador for the Independent Colleges of Indiana, he is the President and Board Member of the Contemporary Club of Indianapolis, Member of SCORE, Past Commander of the American Legion Post 53 and has flown on an Hoor Flight to Washington DC.

Rotary Leadership Institute Next Session Held on August 24, 2019



What is RLI?

The world of Rotary is so much bigger than just your club and district; and there are numerous Rotary resources that are designed to give club members access to tools, services, expertise, and ideas that will help you deliver needed services and support to your communities, near and far.

The Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) is a series of fast-paced, interactive, one-day courses offered to increase a Rotarian's base of knowledge in Rotary and strengthen their leadership skills. The courses are fun, topical, and geared toward active Rotarians who want to be more effective leaders in their clubs.

What Will I Learn? Why Should I Attend?

RLI is structured across three one day courses, consisting of 6 modules each, progressing through Parts I, II, and III. Each Part takes one Saturday. They are designed to provide a broad range of Rotary knowledge and skills to help you better serve your club and community. Some examples of courses include: Creating Hands On Service Projects, International Service, Public Relations, Membership Development, Rotary Leadership, Internal and External Communications and many others.

How Do I Sign Up?

Go to www.hoa-rli.org and select the RLI Events tab, then the correct session and date for District 6560. All sessions, I, II, and III are taught on the same day so you will select the next one in the series as you complete them over time.

The current course fee is \$50 and is often paid by clubs. This covers the cost of the facility, training materials, and breakfast, lunch, and snacks for the participants. To be certain of your funding, please inform your club Treasurer that you plan to attend.

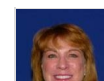
