overgrown and often flooded. Students use the park to walk to school as well as the GCHS Cross-Country Team using it for their practice runs.

It took Luke 20-man hours of planning and documenting this project. In turn, it took 160-man hours and a lot of pizza to do the construction and installation of the wooden boardwalk as well as clearing the trails in the park. The total cost of the project was \$1,600. Luke shared numerous before and after photos of the project. He, his Dad, other scouts and friends did an impressive job.

Foundation Update - October 15, 2020

Rob Caird provided the club with a brief overview of the Rotary Foundation; how it works; how it serves people in need both locally and worldwide.

At the 1917 convention, outgoing Rotary president Arch Klumph proposed setting up an endowment for the purpose of doing good in the world. That one idea, and an initial contribution of \$26.50, set in motion a powerful force that has transformed millions of lives around the globe. Since then, the Foundation has raised over \$5 billion.



The Foundation awarded \$86,677,399 in funding through 1,306 grants during fiscal year 2018. Here is a breakdown of how the funds were directed to the Foundation's Six Areas of Focus:

- Preventing disease \$35,660,986
- Providing clean water & sanitation \$18,761,791
- Supporting education & literacy \$10,998,136
- Growing local economies \$10,503,910
- Improving maternal & child health & mortality \$7,204,677
- Promoting peace & conflict resolution \$3,547,899

Rob shared with the members how in 2016, our Gift of Life Auction raised \$40,000. Through grants that \$40,000 turned into \$588,000 as follows:

- Rotary Club GOL contribution = \$40,000
- District Foundation Grant = \$60,000
- Rotary International Foundation Grant = \$168,000
- Chain of Hope Grant (non- Rotary organization) = \$350,000

Last year, the Rotary Foundation received \$321.9 million in donations. In the sidebar of this issue, you will see the Foundation goals set for our members and club. We encourage every member to give what they can; the minimum contribution is \$25.
