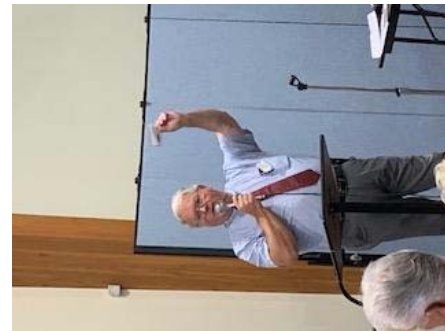

Lance was responsible for the ServeXP 2021 Service Week organized by Park Chapel Church. Lance clarified that it was not merely a day of service, but rather a week of service with 4 days dedicated to prayer and 3 days dedicated to service projects. 40 people were involved in prayer and devotionals and 200 people involved in service projects at 12 different sites, predominately Greenfield and Eastern Hancock schools and Greenfield Park sites. Each service project lasted 3 hours in the hot sun.

Park Chapel views their mission programs as addressing service outside our community and their week of service as serving our local community. Lance stressed that service is a part of Park Chapel's culture. The motto this year for the week of service was "Not to be Served, but to Serve". Their mantra became "Not to, but to".
