Stacey Wixson updated us on Steak N ♦ Bake N ♦ Raffle (SBR)  
The Sponsorship Committee has collected over \$32,000. If you know of anyone or company that would be willing to sponsor, tell them about our event and if you don't feel comfortable soliciting them, then refer

them to John. We are still selling venue sponsorships for \$750 and table sponsorships for \$250 per ad or 3 ads for \$500.

- 50 posters were distributed to local businesses throughout town, today. Arrangements are being made for banners to be printed and located in the 4 corners of our town.
- **SBR TICKETS ARE NOW ON SALE.** Deb Low handed out tickets to Rotarians to buy & sell. Tickets are \$40 each. Each Rotarian is asked to either buy or sell, at least 4 tickets. Rotarians need a ticket to get a steak dinner and complimentary drink, even if they have volunteered to work the event. If you want to put a group together of 8 or more guests, you can request that a table be reserved for your group. This is recommended because people are always scrambling to get a seat. - A 30-person Training Center with an interactive wall
- A podcast room

- Telephone pods, so people can take or make calls without disturbing the other workers in the common area.

No scheduling is required other than for conference rooms. There is a waiting list for the private offices. There are no required leases. There are 35 tenants spanning:

- Tech companies
- Agricultural companies
- The Girl Scouts
- New startups

The campus has coding/programming classes for 7- to 17-year-olds. The IOT Smart Farm is farming much of the 36-acre site and doing research on the food planted on-site.
